Bradley and Jamie Gardner have been in the region for a number of years – they were former residents of Geene County but would regularly come to our region to vacation. They so enjoyed it, and liked what was happening locally with new businesses opening up and other growth they were seeing in the area, they decided to locate here full time and open their own business - The ADK Hatchet House, located



at 196 Second Avenue in Gloversville (in the old OTB Building).

They have totally renovated the inside and it is now a premiere axe throwing venue in our region. There are five axe-throwing lanes in the new venue, along with different seating areas with couches, low and hi tables, and more. See a video of the new venue on their <u>Facebook page</u>. There are board games for those who are waiting to throw or who might just come in for a snack and a drink. Speaking of drinks, they have beer on tap and in cans and bottles and spiked seltzers and more. They also have different snacks available including popcorn, chips, cookies and more. In addition, Nibbles & Bites Food Truck has been on hand for different events. Outside food is also welcomed and House of Pizza will deliver to ADK Hatchet House. "It's a friendly, relaxing, comfortable place," said Brad. "We have really paid attention to the details and you can see it in our set up. We are proud of what we've done and hope that many will come and experience this new business." They are also looking for ideas to collaborate with other local businesses, like they have with House of Pizza.

Axe throwing enthusiasts aged 13 and older are invited to participate at ADK Hatchet House (age 13 needs a parent or guardian with them to play). They are currently collecting names for Thursday night league games, offer corporate retreats, off-hour reservations, birthday parties, bachelor or bachelorette parties, team building, private events – you name what you want, Brad and Jamie are very flexible and can make it happen!

Safety is very important to ADK Hatchet House and whether you're a beginner or seasoned axethrowing veteran, everyone is welcome. They take time with people new to the sport to go over rules and safety features and are always around for questions or to keep an eye out for new groups to help. The axe throwing here is structured; the throwing areas are caged in and separated. It is both safe and fun.

They have gift cards for the holidays; Ladies Night is Friday with \$5 off. Regularly \$22 to play on Fridays it is only \$17 for ladies. They will be bringing in live bands and other music to their venue.

Great time to check out ADK Hatchet House -The Chamber is having a ribbon-cutting at ADK Hatchet House's Grand Opening on Friday, November 8 at 5pm. This event is not to be missed!! #### 85<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY SCREENING OF THE WORLD PREMIERE OF 'DRUMS ALONG THE MOHAWK' STARRING HENRY FONDA

On Sunday, November 3, 2024, the Glove Theatre Education Series will offer a FREE screening of *Drums along the Mohawk*, 85 years since its world premiere at the same venue. Sponsored by the Johnstown Chapter of the Daughters of American Revolution Chapter (DAR), the screening will start at 2:00 pm.

Before the screening, there will be a brief historical introduction by the DAR and Samantha Hall-Saladino, Glove Theatre Historian, Executive Director of the Fulton County Historical Society, and Fulton County Historian.

Informational tables will be available from the Daughters of the American Revolution, Fort Plain Museum, Fulton County Historical Society, and the Fulton County Visitor Bureau. Additionally, a display of an original costume from the movie and some other historical items from the film from the Glove Museum, Fort Plain Museum, and Fulton County Historical Society will be on display in the lobby.

Drums Along the Mohawk is a 1939 American historical drama film based on the 1936 novel of the same name by Walter Edmonds. The film stars Henry Fonda and Claudette Colbert and depicts settlers in the New York frontier in the Mohawk Valley during the American Revolution. The film highlights settlers of the Mohawk Valley such as German-speaking Palatines, Nicholas Herkimer, and Peter Gansevoort.

The Glove Theatre was one of five locations that were granted the 'location premiere' for the screening, a popular trend in Hollywood at the time, wherein communities could apply to be given a world-premiere status based on geographic location in films. In total, 40 municipalities applied and five (5) were awarded, given their geographic location within the Mohawk Valley.



The first award went to the Gloversville home of the Glove Theatre, flagship venue, and headquarters for Schine Enterprise, citing its geographic location cited in the novel of Fort

Johnson and the Sacandaga Valley, which had been flooded not even a decade earlier for the Sacandaga Reservoir. Actors from the film and executives from 20<sup>TH</sup> Century Fox were in attendance as well as many local municipal officials within Fulton County. Other venues did have events and notables from within the region attend, however, all the attention was given to Gloversville, giving it the world-premiere location title. A month earlier, The Glove Theatre reopened after being closed for several weeks for modernization, which resulted in Art Deco style renovations throughout which included a new marquee, by noted designer John Eberson.

"As the Glove Theatre preps for programming for America250, we felt this historical significance of this film was necessary to screen this year, 85 years after its premiere," says Samantha Hall-Saladino, Glove Theatre Historian. 

#### CAREER CON A SUCCESS FOR STUDENTS, EDUCATORS AND BUSINESSES

On Wednesday, October 16, the Chamber in collaboration with HFM BOCES CTE (Career & Technical Education) program, SUNY Fulton-Montgomery, and local businesses welcomed almost 1,200 eighth grade students to the FM campus for our first annual CAREER CON, a career exploration event. School dis-



tricts that participated with their students and staff included Amsterdam, Fonda-Fultonville, Johnstown, Oppenheim-Ephratah St. Johnsville, St. Mary's Institute, Wheelerville, Broadalbin-Perth, Canajoharie, Fort Plain, Gloversville, Lake Pleasant, Mayfield, Northville and Wells. SUNY FM students also had a chance to visit the business displays.

Career Con was created in part to support the districts' hopes for more regional events, which aligns to the core beliefs of HFM BOCES and the Chamber but also with the support of grant initiatives through SUNY FM. The goal for Career Con was

to offer eighth graders in the HFM region career awareness through "hands on" exposure to our regional businesses, and the opportunity to speak with business representatives about what type of jobs are available at their businesses and in our region. In addition, businesses were telling the Chamber that they also wanted the opportunity to expose students to what they have to offer earlier. "We want students in our districts to graduate from here, but also to have the opportunity to work, live and play here," said Nicole Walrath-VanAlstyne, the Chamber's Director of Workforce Development. "We thought this would be a great introduction to a multitude of businesses who have so many employment opportunities for our students."

District 8th graders arrived on the FM campus at different times during the day, between 8:45 and 12pm taking a look at programs and businesses both outside, inside the campus gymnasium and in Raider's Cove. They had the opportunity to speak with representatives in pathways in which they were already interested, and the businesses were clustered in career pathways

(16 different pathways) to make it easier for students to navigate. In this way, they were given exposure to a multitude of businesses and careers. In all, there were 60 businesses who participated in this important event. All of the CTE programs were also on display, as they saw real value in "marketing" their programs to these 8th graders who will have to make choices about their high school paths in the coming months. At noon, the business displays were then opened up to any SUNY FM



students who wanted to speak with businesses about current or future employment.

"Eighth grade is such a pivotal year for our region's students," continued Walrath-VanAlstyne. "They will be making decisions about their next four years, and we want to give them the best information we can to make these decisions about where they want to further their education." Each student who participated was provided with a Career Con "swag bag" which were sponsored partly by Amsterdam Printing. Additional sponsors included:

Early feedback was all positive, so much so, in fact, that the collaborators are already thinking about next year, and perhaps expanding the Career Con event to include additional grade levels in the HFM BOCES component school districts.
