


Together, through programs like Chamber Checks, events like the golf tournament, and the many services we provide, we continue to strengthen the business community and create opportunities that benefit us all.

This week-long celebration aims to honor the contributions of the manufacturing sector by sharing information about all the work the sector has done in the last year and its impact on the country's economy. What to Expect:

A Week of Data and Content: The Census Bureau will provide a variety of statistics, data visualizations, and stories to inform the public about the manufacturing sector.

- Manufacturing Day (MFG Day): This annual event, celebrated on the first Friday of October, serves as the culmination of Manufacturing Week. It's a day for manufacturers to open their doors to showcase modern manufacturing and inspire interest in manufacturing careers.
- **Events and Awareness**: Communities, businesses, and policymakers are encouraged to participate in the week by sharing information on social media and attending or hosting events.

How to Get Involved:

Follow on Social Media: Look for information on the Census Bureau's (Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, YouTube, X) and <u>The Manufacturing Institute</u>'s social media pages (X, LinkedIn, Facebook) using hashtags like #MFGDay25.

Attend Events: Check the <u>Manufacturing USA</u> website or other local event listings for events near you.

Register and Participate: If you are a manufacturer, you can contact a MEP Center (Manufacturing Extension Partnership) to learn more about hosting a Manufacturing Day event. The New York Manufacturing Extension Partnership (NY MEP) is a network of organizations that provide growth and innovation services to small and midsized manufacturers in every corner of the state to help them create and retain jobs, increase profits, and save time and money. The regional New York MEP Centers for Fulton and Montgomery Counties:

Advanced Institute for Manufacturing at Mohawk Valley Community College.

The institute provides centralized manufacturing and technology assistance, leveraging MVCC's partner programs in workforce development, business incubation, and STEM - and supporting the region's priority industry cluster - cybersecurity.

SBA AND DOL SIGN MOU TO SUPPORT DOMESTIC MANUFACTURING

Enhanced collaboration will cultivate pipeline of skilled workers, restore American industrial dominance

The Small Business Administration (SBA) has partnered with the Department of Labor (DOL) to boost workforce development for manufacturers through enhanced datasharing and coordinated programs like Registered Apprenticeships. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU), signed on July 16, 2025, aims to cultivate a skilled labor pipeline by aligning DOL's workforce development resources with SBA's capital and contracting tools, ensuring American manufacturers have the workers they need.

Key Aspects of the Partnership

• Enhanced Collaboration: The

MOU formalizes cooperation between the SBA and DOL to support U.S. manufacturing, with a particular focus on small manufacturers, which make up 98% of the sector.

- **Data Sharing and Coordination:**Both agencies will expand data-sharing and coordinate initiatives like Registered Apprenticeships, the <u>Veterans' Employment and Training Service</u> (VETS), and American Job Centers.
- **Bridging Capital and Workforce:** The agreement connects the SBA's financial instruments (like the 7(a), 504, and microloan programs) with DOL's workforce training initiatives.
- **Building a Skilled Labor Pipeline:** The goal is to create a steady supply of skilled workers to meet the needs of domestic producers.

Goals of the Initiative

- **Support Domestic Manufacturing:** The partnership is a key part of the ongoing effort to restore American industry and jobs.
- **Strengthen the Skilled Workforce:** The initiative aims to prepare America's workforce for the opportunities in the manufacturing sector.

Boost Capital and Contracting:By aligning resources, the SBA will help manufacturers access capital and contracting opportunities.

Earlier this year, the SBA launched the <u>Made in America Manufacturing Initiative</u>, with a commitment to cut \$100 billion in red tape, promote workforce development, and expand access to capital for small manufacturers. The agency also recently announced a new <u>Onshoring Portal</u>, which connects small businesses with a database of more than 1 million domestic suppliers – empowering job creators to support American jobs, shift supply chains back home, and more.



HFM BOCES APPOINTS FIRST-EVER STUDENT VOICES TO BOARD OF EDUCATION

Student voices will officially join the HFM BOCES Board of Education, as two area seniors have been named its first-ever ex officio members.

Madison Milby of the Greater Johnstown School District and Charlotte Nare of Canajoharie Central School will be introduced as student board members during the organization's next board of education meeting on Wednesday, Sept. 24.

Milby, a senior at HFM PTECH, is enrolled in the program's Business Management & Marketing pathway. She is a member of the Johnstown High School drama club and the varsity cheerleading

team. At PTECH she has been involved in student government and book club. She hopes to someday enter the real estate industry and become a house flipper.

"It means a lot to me to be selected to the board," said Milby. "To be someone that other students can come to and share ideas or concerns with is such an honor."

Nare is a senior enrolled in the HFM Career and Technical Education (CTE) Medical Assisting program. At Canajoharie she par-

A new law that took effect on July 1, 2025, requires all school districts and Boards of Cooperative Educational Services across the state to appoint at least one ex officio student board member. These student representatives will attend public meetings and serve as the voice of the student body.

Student board members will serve in an advisory role and are not allowed to vote or attend executive

sessions. They must also be high school students enrolled for at least one year.

WHEN YOUR BUSINESS OR PERSONAL INFORMATION IS LOST OR EXPOSED

The Federal Trade Commissions – ftc.gov

Did you get a notice that says your information was exposed in a data breach? Did you lose your wallet? Did your online account get hacked? Or did you learn that someone tried but failed to use your information to open an account?

You could be at risk for identity theft. That's when someone uses your information — like your Social Security number or credit card — without your permission. If someone has already used your information to open a new account or make a purchase: Report it at IdentityTheft.gov and find out what to do next to recover.

If an identity thief hasn't misused your information yet: You don't need to file an FTC Identity Theft report. Keep reading to find out what you can do to help protect yourself from identity theft.

Businesses experiencing identity theft should report it to IdentityTheft.gov, the local police, and the FBI's Internet Crime Complaint Center (IC3) at ic3.gov for cyber-related incidents. It is also crucial to contact your bank and credit reporting agencies, and consider reaching out to your business's Secretary of State and a legal advisor.

Businesses experiencing a data breach should report to law enforcement (local police, <u>FBI/Secret Service</u>), the <u>Federal Trade Commission (FTC)</u> (especially if personal health information is involved or 500+ individuals are affected), and relevant state agencies as required by law. They should also notify affected individuals and consider the IRS and the <u>Internet Crime Complaint Center</u> (IC3) for specific situations.

Key steps to help protect yourself from identity theft

- Check your <u>credit report</u> to see if an identity thief has used your information.
- * Get your free credit reportfrom AnnualCreditReport.com.

- * Review the reports, and if you see an account or debt you don't recognize, contact the company and ask about it. If someone used your information to open a new account or make a purchase, report it at IdentityTheft.gov and learn how to dispute the information on your credit report.
- * Freeze your credit to make it harder for someone to use your information. A <u>credit freeze</u> keeps people from getting into your report. While a freeze is in place, nobody can open a new credit account. And it's free to place the freeze, or to temporarily lift the freeze if you need to apply for new credit.

Experian and Equifax provide different business credit scores, each with its own scoring models and ranges. Dun & Bradstreet is the third largest credit bureau for businesses. Business credit scores are based on a company's Employer Identification Number (EIN) and its financial history

- * If you're concerned about identity theft, you can also place a free, one-year <u>fraud alert</u> by contacting one of the credit bureaus. A fraud alert makes it harder for someone to open a new credit account in your name because a business has to verify your identity before it opens the account.
- * Accept free credit monitoring if a company offers it. Credit monitoring services scan activity that shows up on your credit reports. Depending on the service, it will usually alert you when something happens on your credit reports, like a company checking your credit, a new loan or credit card, or a company reporting a late payment.
- * Keep checking your credit reports periodically at <u>AnnualCreditReport.com</u> to watch for anything you don't recognize. You can check your reports online every week for free.

THE IRS WARNS ALL TAXPAYERS TO BEWARE OF COSTLY SOCIAL MEDIA TAX SCAMS

The Internal Revenue Service is alerting taxpayers about a growing number of fraudulent tax schemes circulating on social media that promote the misuse of credits such as the Fuel Tax Credit and the Sick and Family Leave Credit. These scams have led thousands of taxpayers to file inac-



curate or frivolous returns, often resulting in the denial of refunds and steep penalties. Since 2022, the IRS has seen a surge in questionable refund

claims fueled by misleading social media posts and bad actors posing as tax experts. Many of the posts falsely claim that all taxpayers are eligible for credits they do not actually qualify for, such as those meant for self-employed individuals or businesses. The IRS routinely publishes and updates a list of frivolous positions on IRS.gov that could lead to the imposition of penalties.

"These schemes are not only misleading but can cost taxpayers dearly," said James Clifford, IRS Director Return Integrity and Compliance Services. "People who follow this advice could end up with rejected claims and a penalty of up to \$5,000 in addition to any other penalties that might apply. So far, the IRS has imposed over 32,000 penalties costing taxpayers more than \$162 million. It's in the taxpayer's best interest to stay informed."

How to spot these scams

These scams often have common traits:

- Social media posts that claim everyone qualifies for certain tax credits.
- Promises of "easy" or "fast" refund with minimal documentation.
- Instructions to file amended returns, even if you did not originally qualify for the credits.

Encouragement to ignore IRS letters or respond with false information.

What happens when a taxpayer falls for a scam Taxpayers who submit false claims may face serious consequences:

- Delayed refunds.
- Denied refund claims.
- A \$5,000 civil penalty under Internal Revenue Code Section 6702 for filing a frivolous return.

Subject to further IRS examination and enforcement action.

What taxpayers can do if they are targeted

Taxpayers who believe they have been misled or filed an incorrect return should:

Amend the tax return as soon as possible using Form 1040-X, Amended U.S. Individual Income Tax Return.

Respond promptly to any IRS letters or notices.

Seek help from a reputable tax professional or the IRS's

official resources at IRS.gov.

If you suspect a tax scam, report it to the IRS by emailing phishing@irs.gov or file a complaint with the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA).

Stay informed

The IRS urges all taxpayers to be cautious when relying on social media posts. Always verify claims with credible sources or consult a qualified tax professional.
